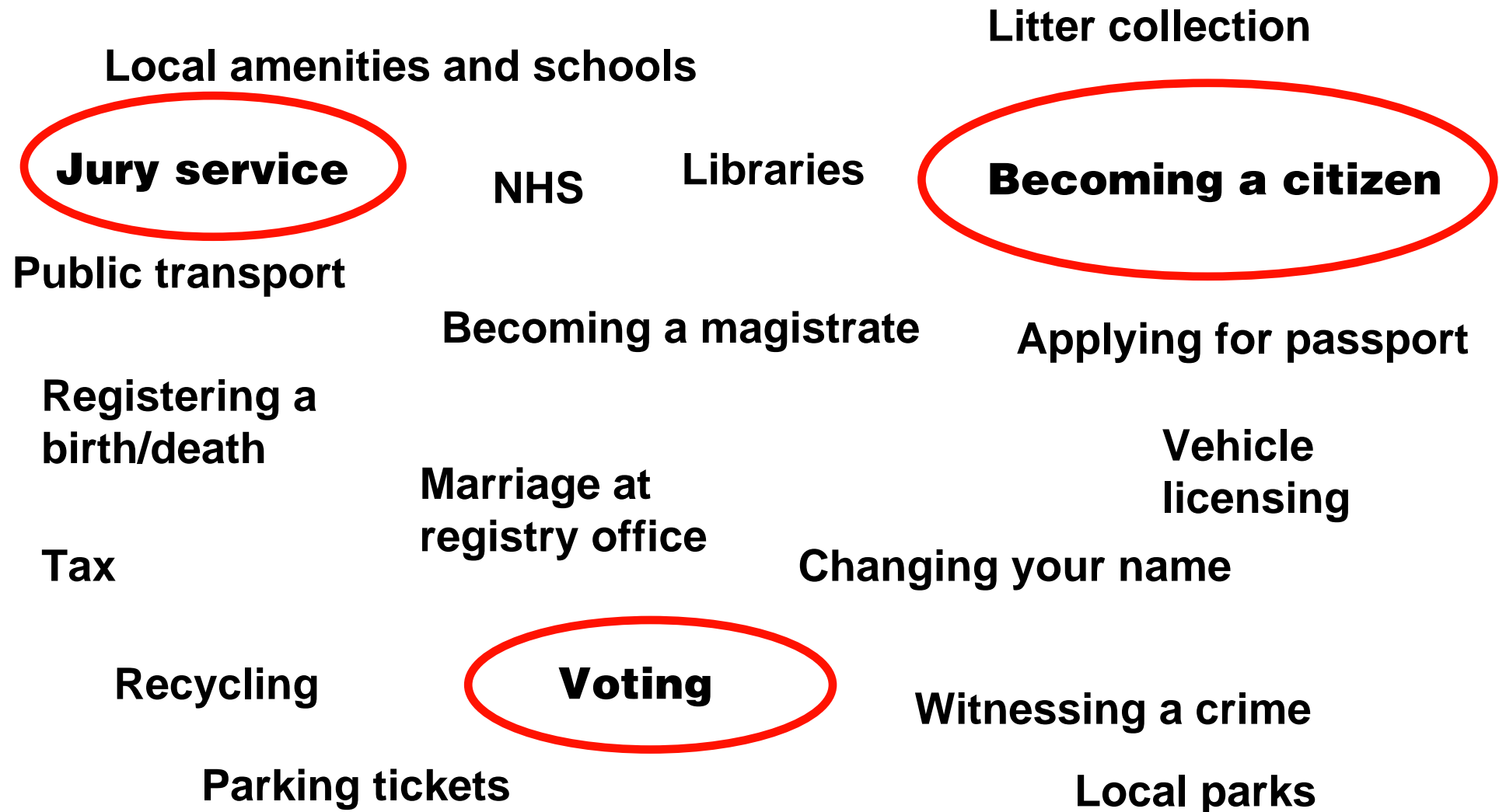


- Being a citizen!
